

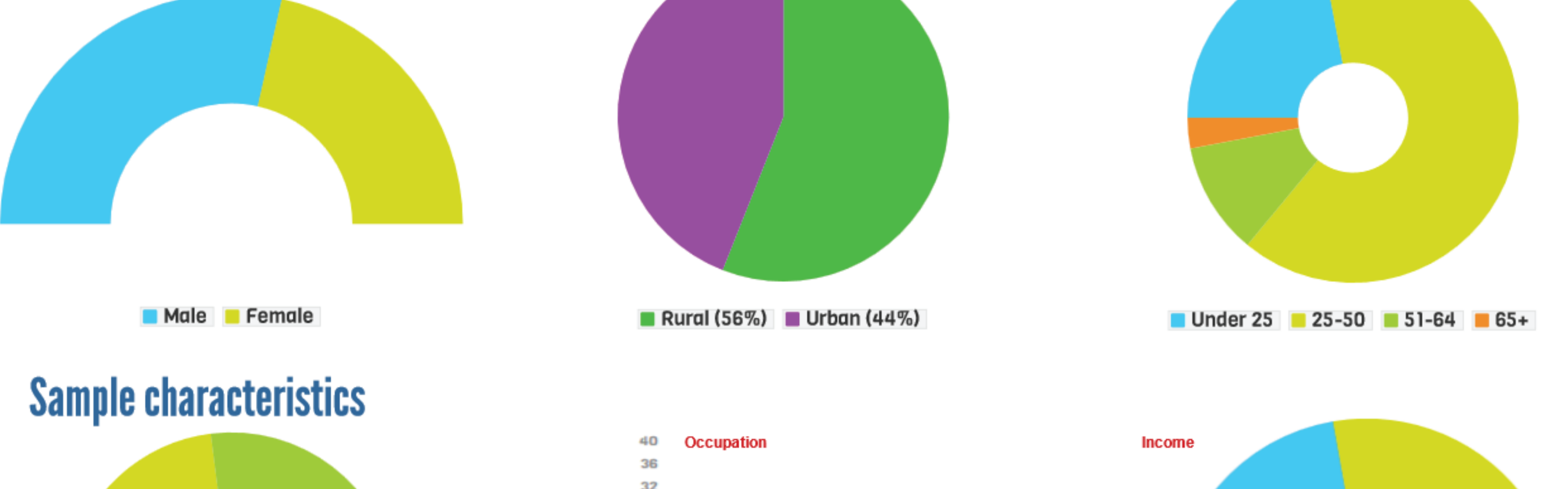
# GLOBAL CORRUPTION BAROMETER 2013 KENYA

Transparency International's Global Corruption Barometer is the only worldwide public opinion survey on views and experiences of corruption.

The Global Corruption Barometer is a rich insight into people's personal experience of corruption, as well as their views on the situation in their country.

Transparency International Kenya interviewed 1121 people in a national survey in October and November 2012 using face to face interviews.

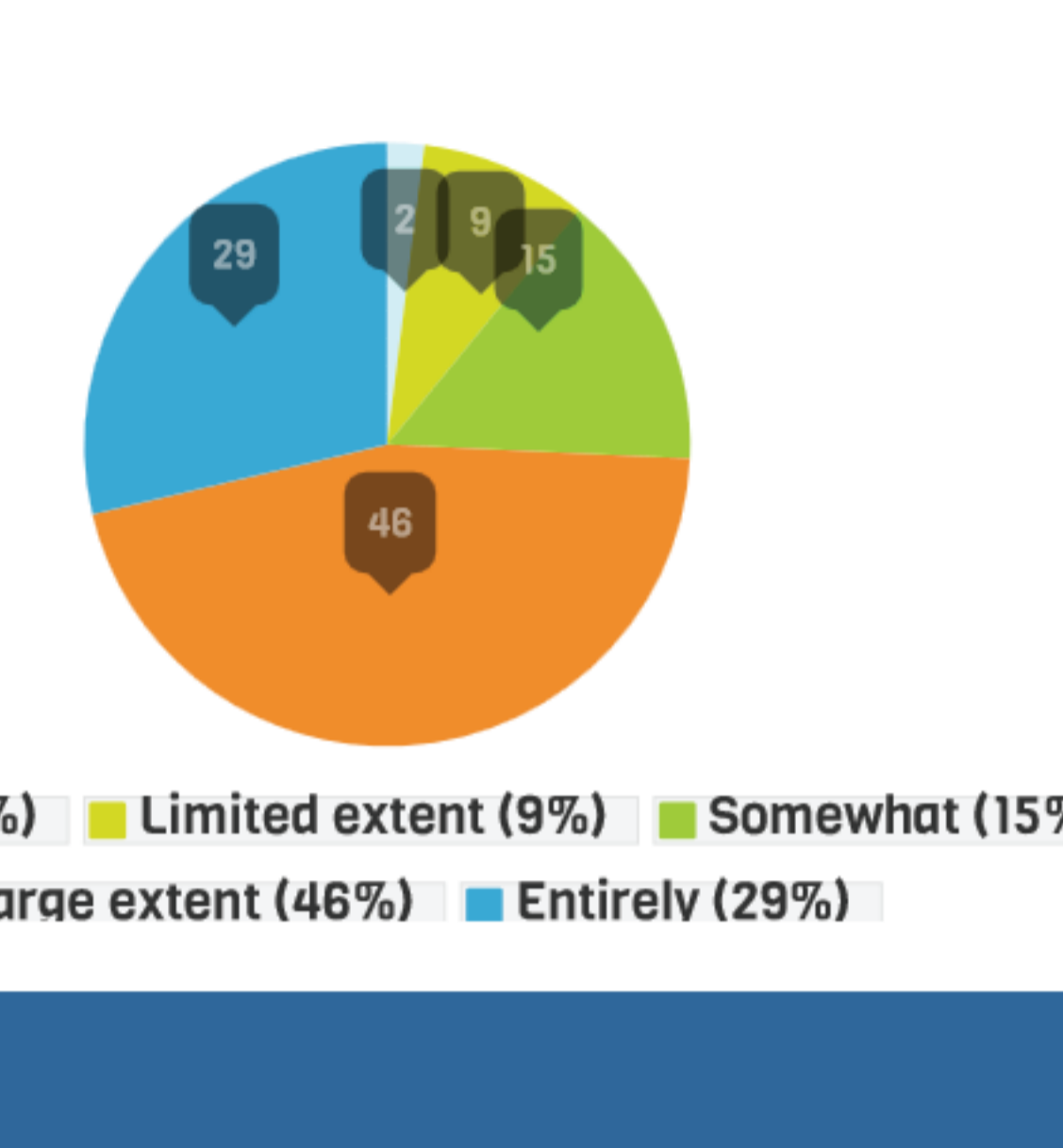

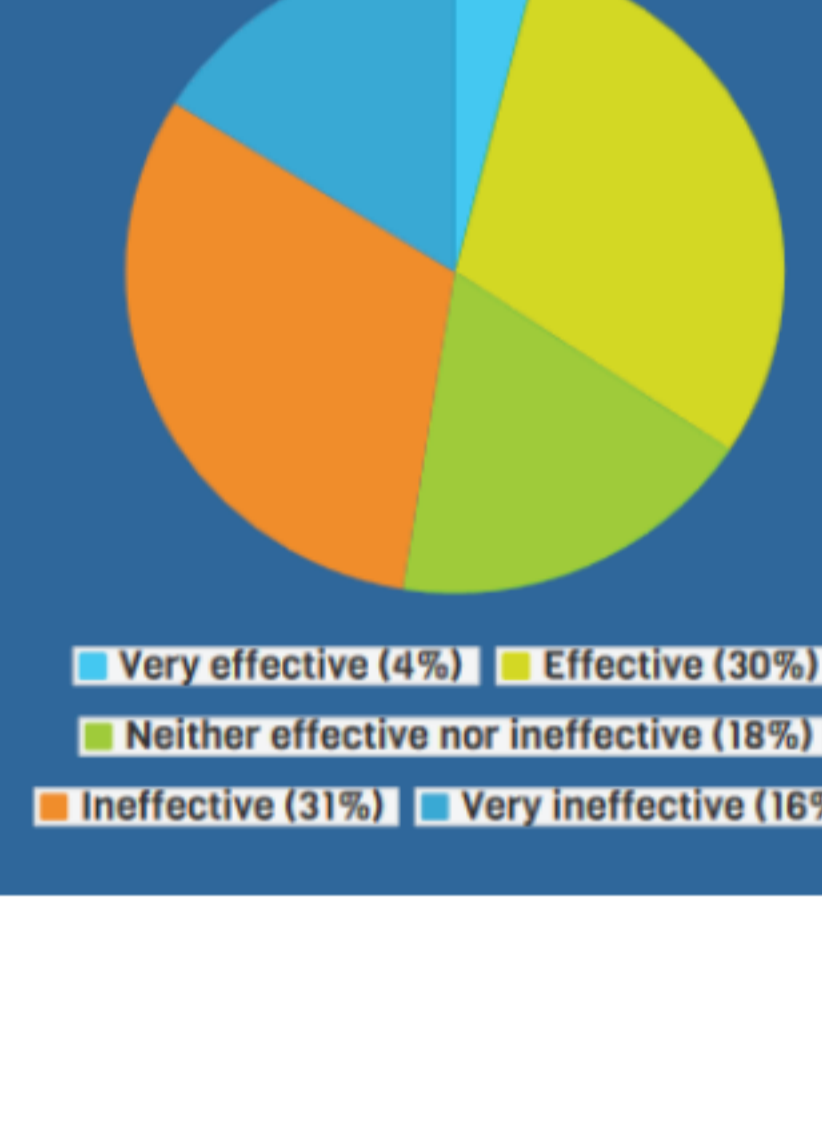
## Over the past 2 years, has the level of corruption in Kenya changed?



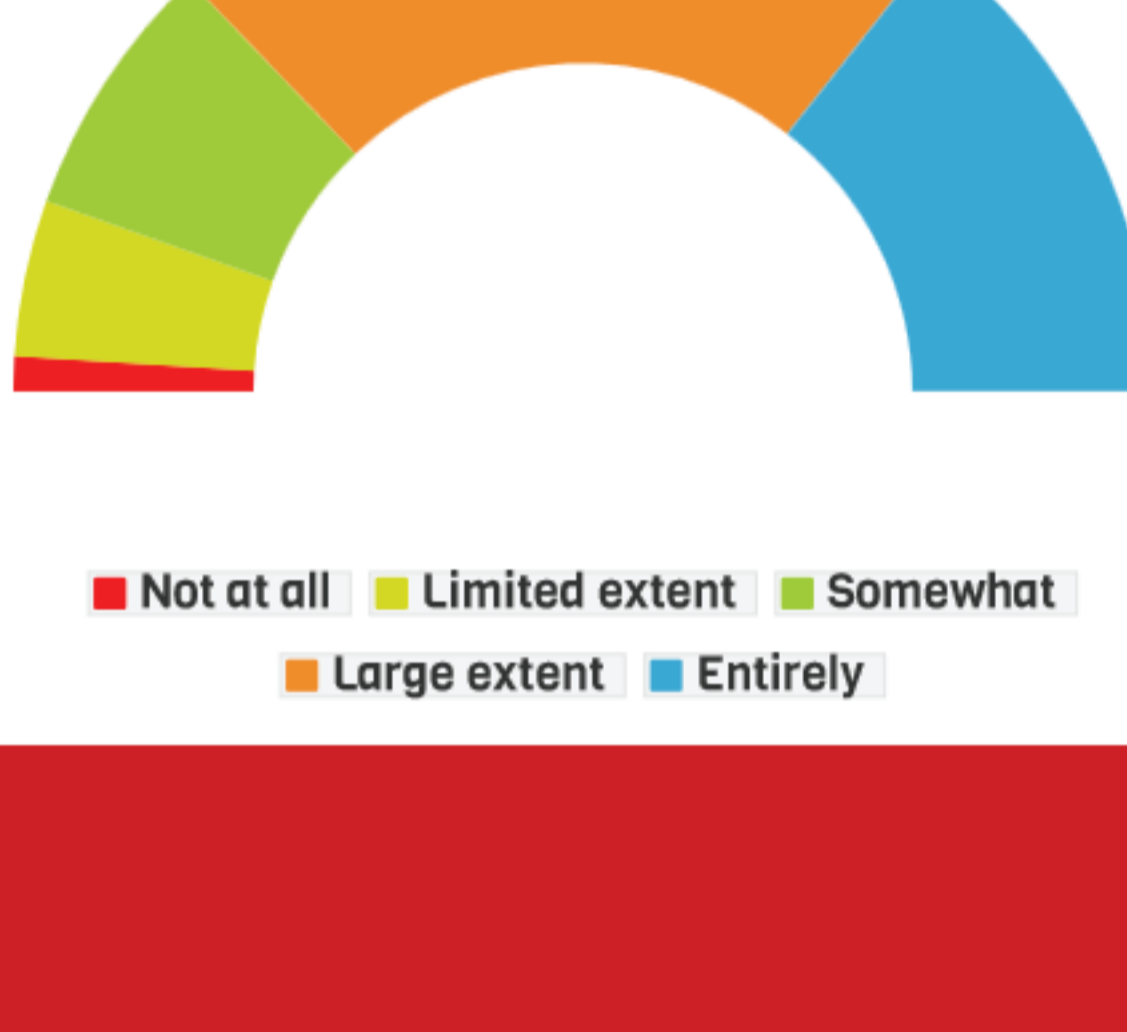
## To what extent do you believe that corruption is a problem in the public sector in Kenya?



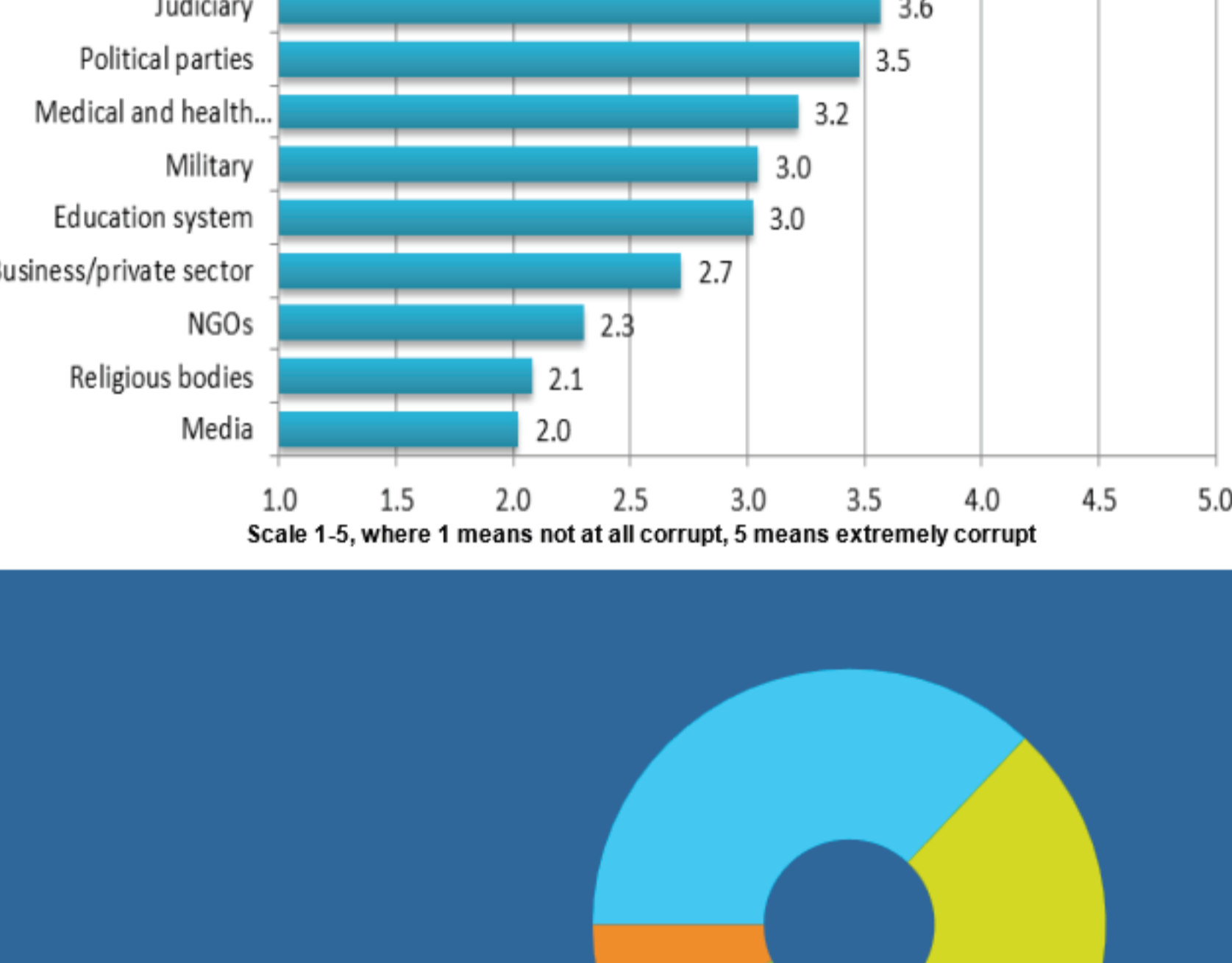
## In your dealings with public sector, how important are personal contacts in order to get things done?



## How effective do you think your government's actions are in the fight against corruption?

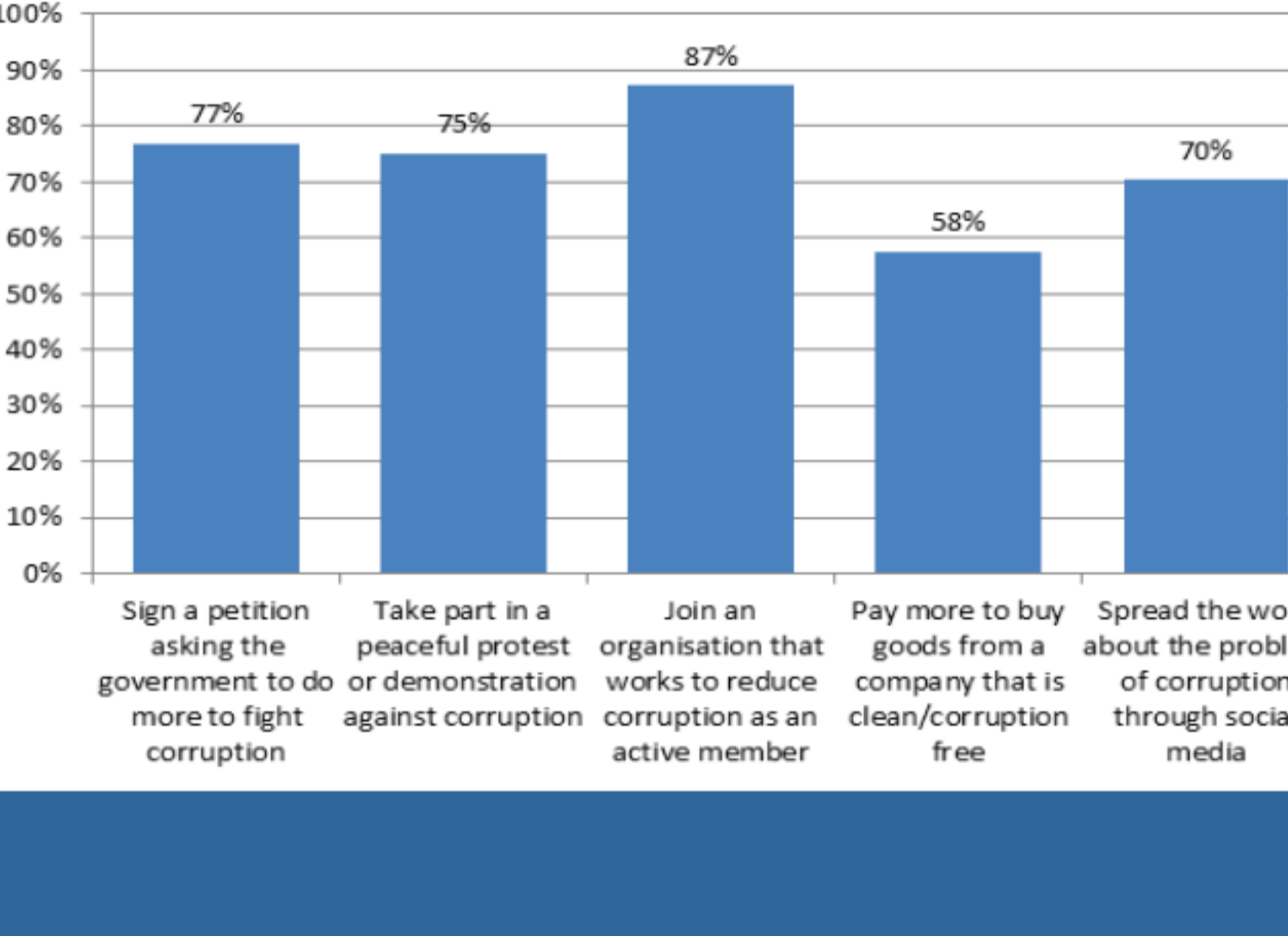


## To what extent is Kenya's government run by a few big entities acting in their own best interests?



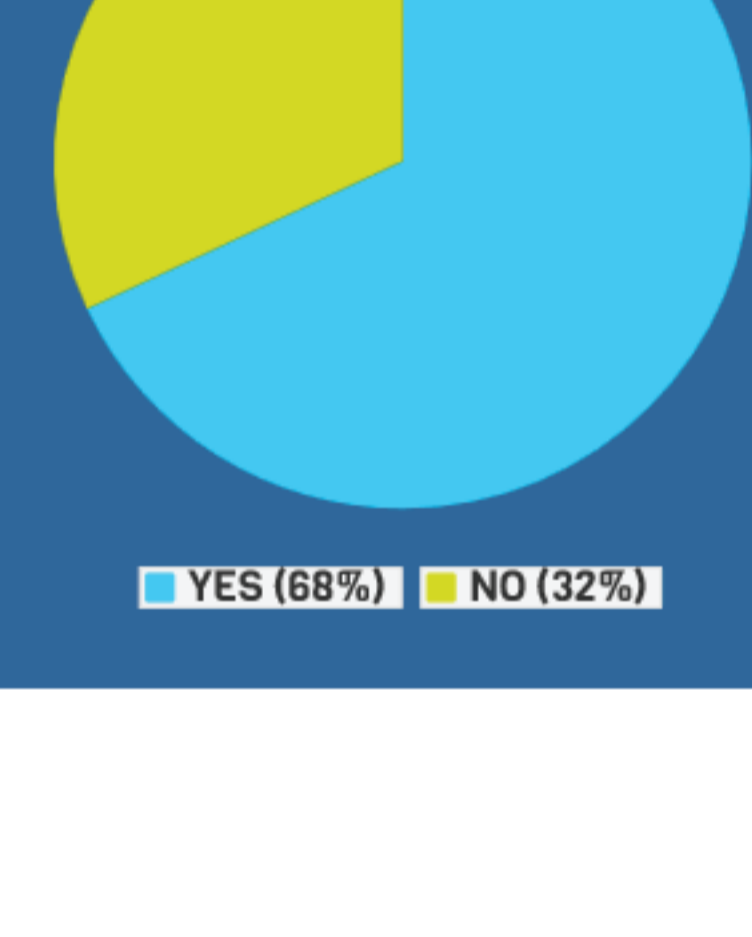

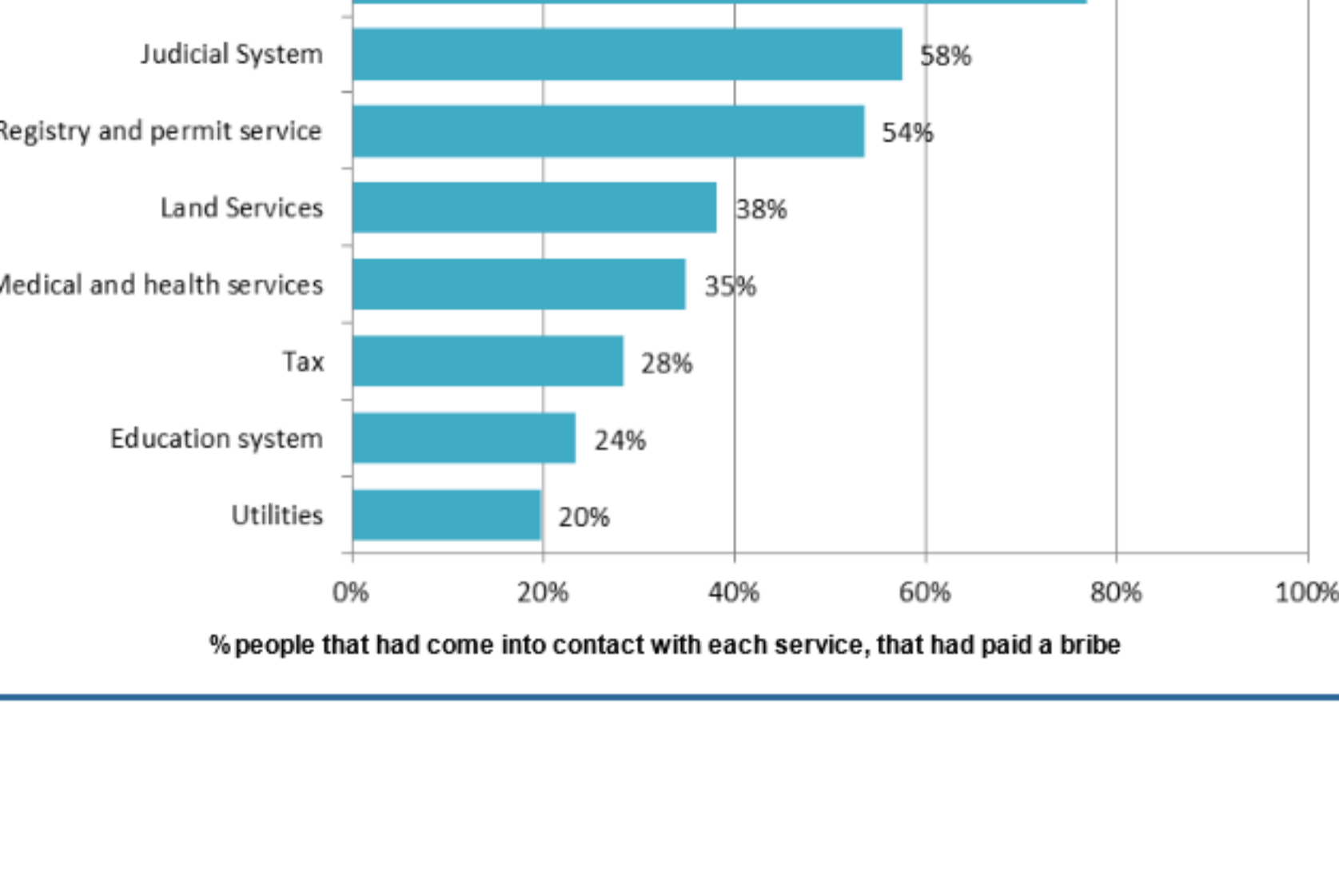

## If you were to report, where would you report an incident of corruption?

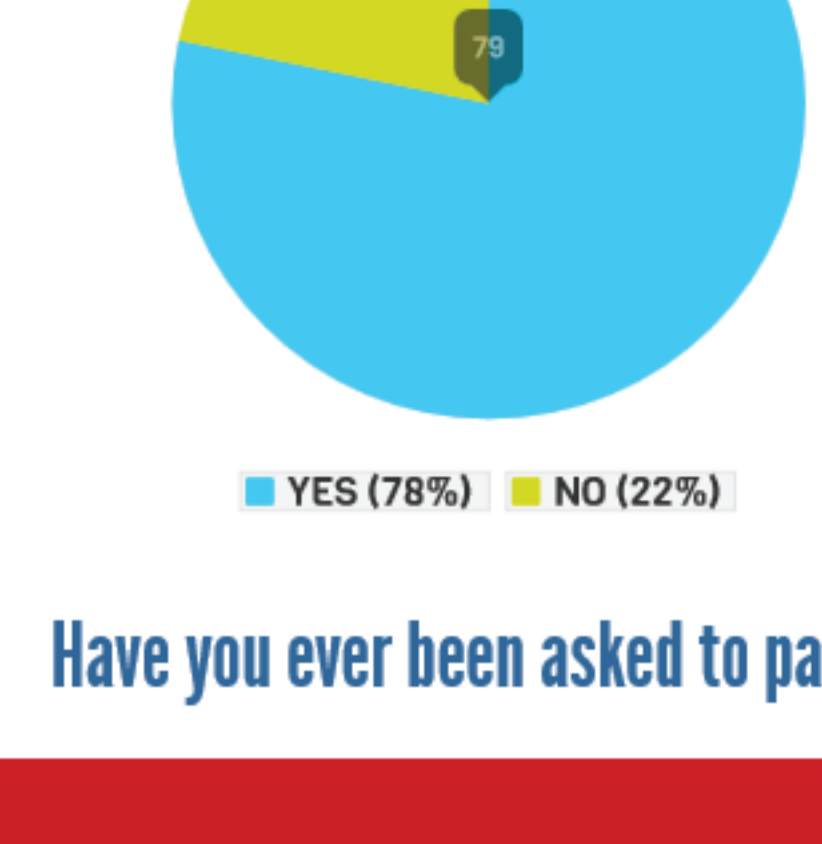
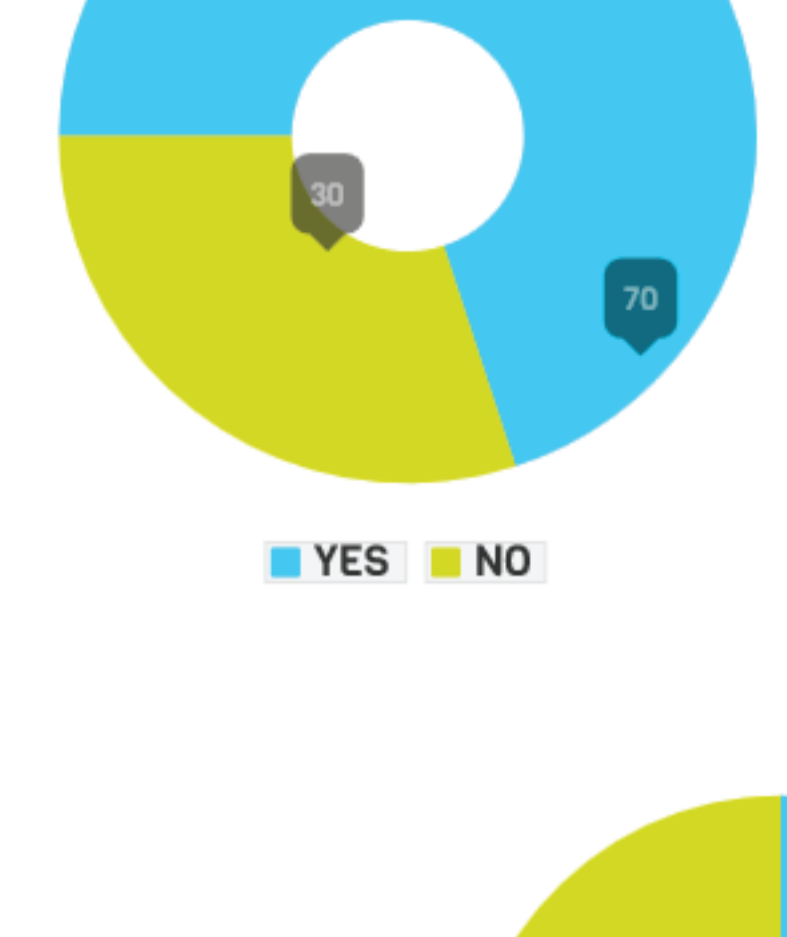


## Why would you not report an incident of corruption?

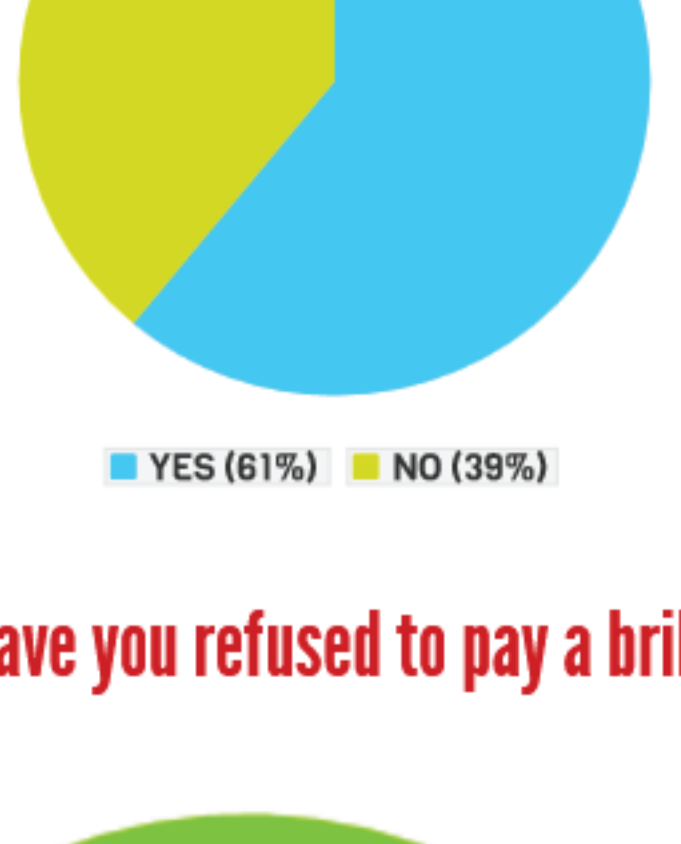
